## Shoot your own film

There's only one week left for students to submit their entry forms for a short-film competition, the National Geographic Channel - Think Again Awards.

Supported by the Education and Manpower Bureau (EMB), the contest is open to all secondary school students.

Each participant is required to submit a five- to 10-minute English documentary that illustrates how they see the world. The themes include: nature and wildlife; environment and conservation; people and culture.

Entry forms, available at [www.EnglishBuilder.hk/ThinkAgain](http://www.EnglishBuilder.hk/ThinkAgain), must be submitted by November 20, and the documentary, recorded on VCD or DVD, by January 8.

A visual guide on how to make a good documentary has been distributed to schools.

Yeung King-fai, EMB's senior school development officer, encouraged students to show their talents.

'The students will be able to gain a wider perspective of the world they live in,' said Mr Yeung.

'By participating in the contest, students can also interact with society, develop correct values and learn how to get along with others.'

The awards include best documentary, best narrator, best director and best cinematography.
